
Welcome to Beverley



Shire of Beverley

The heritage wheatbelt town of Beverley is 130 km east of Perth on the Avon River. For thousands of years the Ballardong people lived along the *Coluger* (Avon River) and knew the area as *Wergijan*, rich in bush food and native animals. Officially founded in 1838, Beverley is one of WA's oldest settlements. Beverley was one of the first areas opened for agriculture after Ensign Dale was accompanied by Governer Stirling to inspect the region, this lead to large tracts of land taken up for farming.

Museums & History

Beverley's rich history is captured at the wonderful volunteer run Dead Finish Museum and the Beverley Visitor Centre has a fantastic interactive aeronautical display. Or check out the impressive private collection at Fergusons Vintage Collection. Ensure you walk the Vincent Street Heritage Walk and discover the history behind the buildings.

Culture & Arts

Stroll down our beautiful main street and admire the variety of architecture from the colonial period of the late 1880's, Art deco 1930's right up to the newly built Cornerstone. Along Vincent Street there are fabulous art galleries, studios, Platform Theatre and fabulous art murals.

Wildflowers & Nature

Brooking Street Reserve in town has a bountiful number of orchids and wildflowers in Spring and the Dale River Reserve is a tranquil spot to take a walk along the river trail. For stunning views venture out to County Peak and Yenyening Lakes.

Action & Adventure

Moort Wabiny Park is the perfect place to spend the morning or afternoon with the kids with a skate park, pump track, basketball court and nature play. If the adults are feeling adventurous, the Beverley Soaring Society offer flights in gliders or check out the Motox or Offroad Motorsports tracks.
