



Geocaching

Geocaching is a great way to explore the beautiful landscapes of the Avon Valley. There are numerous geocache hidden throughout the Shire to entertain the kids for the day.

Beverley Visitor Centre

You cannot say you have visited Beverley without stamping your Australian Adventure Passport and purchased your Beverley collector coin both located at the Visitor Centre. While you are there check out the interactive display and 1:5 scale model of the Silver Centenary plane.

Moort Wabiny Park

The Youth precinct on Vincent Street has something for everyone. Nature playground for the little ones, skate park, half-court basketball court and an amazing pump track. Located in the main street near all the conveniences.

County Peak

Get the kids out exploring County Peak. It is not for the faint-hearted, the hike to the top is relatively easy but the terrain can be slippery. Ensure you wear appropriate footwear and watch for wildlife. The view from the summit at 360m is stunning, where seven shires can be seen.

Nature walks

Immerse your family in nature in one of our reserves including Oak Park, Mortlock River and Goomalling Golf course.

Find tadpoles in the gnammas at Oak Park, then wander through the casuarinas in search of native fauna. See if you can find the stick hut hidden amongst the bush and create your own cubby.

Offering a fully-immersive interpretive educational experience, a kids trail and customised experiences for groups. Visit the centre to learn about the Nyoongar culture. Don't miss a chance to pick up your activity book or Australian Adventure Passport while you're there.

Aquatic Facility & Water Playground

Both Northam and Wundowie boast a public swimming pool; the Northam facility on Peel Terrace has a 50 metre, 8 lane outdoor solar heated Olympic pool with ramp access, a 25 metre leisure pool with ramp access, kiddies activity zone, BBQ areas, and 4 thrilling water slides. During the summer months, the little ones can also experience Bernard Park's exciting water playground.

Located on the corner of Peel Terrace & Chidlow Street Northam, the precinct features a skate bowl, ramps, parkour, half-court basketball, table tennis, flying fox, BBQ facilities and shade and shelter for a picnic. Shire of Northam boasts numerous other recreation areas throughout, including the Wundowie Skate Park and various playgrounds.

Nature Walks

Scattered throughout Northam are an abundance of nature areas for the little ones who love to explore. Walk the Avon River bridges, head towards Burlong Pool on the Dorntj Koorlinny Trail, or explore the Kep Track. A little further out of town, Clackline offers a number of walk trails starting at Lion Park.
